School Community

Emeryville is a 1.2 square mile, bustling urban city in the heart of the San Francisco Bay Area, wedged between Berkeley, Oakland, and the Bay. Not unlike most Bay Area cities, the population of 9,000 residents and workforce of 25,000 daily commuters are divided culturally, ethnically, economically, and geographically.

Emery Unified School District (EUSD) has less than 800 students at two schools, K-6 and 7-12. Eighty percent of the students are eligible for the Federal free and reduced lunch 80% and 13% are English learners. The student body of Emery Secondary School is culturally diverse with a population that is 66% African-American, 13% Hispanic, 11% Asian, 7% Multi Racial, 2% Filipino, and 1% White. Emery Secondary School is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges
